A Conversation With an Echo: The Old Testament's Use of the Old Testament

How did David read the Pentateuch? How did Isaiah, Jeremiah, and other prophets use and understand Moses' writings? What does our analysis reveal about the place and purpose of early writings in subsequent revelation? This course will examine this fascinating and instructive phenomenon and will also provide a "sneak preview" of Dr. Sailhamer's new book, *Theology of the Pentateuch*.



Dr. Sailhamer is an internationally-respected scholar, with over a dozen books in print and three in preparation. They include his Introduction of Old Testament Theology, Pentateuch as Narrative and the NIV Compact Bible Commentary. Dr. Sailhamer is fluent in several languages, including modern Hebrew.
