The Portland Counseling Program site welcomed a wonderful incoming class this fall. Additionally, the program saw some changes and additions of faculty, which are notable. Dr. Beth Peterson (Assistant Professor) began Fall 2021. Dr. Hannah Acquaye (Associate Professor) was a member of the core faculty team through the 2021-2022 academic year. Dr. Jeremiah Peck (Assistant Professor) and Dr. Michelle Fielder (Assistant Professor) began Fall 2022. The former Program Director, Dr. Kay Bruce (Full Professor) retired January 2022. Dr. Rachel Heffield (Assistant Professor) filled the role of Program Director and Center Chair in January 2022. Faculty are continuing to review curriculum to ensure offering the most up-to-date, integrative, clinically beneficial classes to prepare students effectively for practice and licensure. CACREP accreditation continues to benefit us in maintaining a strong program.

GRADUATES: 20 (summer, 2021 through spring, 2022)

THE FOUR-YEAR COMPLETION RATE: 65.5%

NCE/NCMHCE EXAMINATION PASS RATE: 100% of 2021-2022 examinees (15 students passed)

JOB PLACEMENT RATE OF GRADUATES: 100% *poor response rate on graduate survey.
