Allow me to give you a partial list of items that represent an investment on your part here at the seminary:

### San Jose Class of 2011 Inaugurates New Graduate Giving Program

It is always exciting to share great news . . . This past year, the graduating class of 2011 decided to make history with a collective gift-giving and volunteer effort for Western Seminary San Jose. The goal was to have at least 70% participation and raise \$5,000 or more. This class exceeded this goal with 73% participation and \$5,145 in gifts and pledges ranging from \$10 to \$1000.
