As a Western Seminary student, you'll take courses in a variety of disciplines, including Bible, theology, language, spiritual formation and ministry. Some of these courses are designed to help you engage in deep theological thinking. Others are intended for practical ministry skill building or personal spiritual growth. As you create a plan for your studies, we advise you to include courses from each of the columns below for a balanced schedule.
