Position Summary: Western Seminary is seeking a full-time Assistant or Associate Professor in Biblical Studies, with a New Testament emphasis. The successful candidate will be a member of Western's Center for Biblical and Theological Studies (CBTS) and will be located at the Seminary's Portland campus.

Responsibilities: The primary instructional duties will be to teach master's level courses, primarily in New Testament, and to conduct seminars and supervise theses in the Th.M. program. The individual will participate actively in the department (CBTS) and the Seminary community at large. This will include mentoring students, engaging in research and scholarship, and serving on faculty committees.

Qualifications:

Education: Completed Ph.D. in New Testament (New Testament, ABD candidates considered)

Experience: Demonstrated experience and skill teaching both in the classroom and online, as well as evidence of scholarly contributions, student mentorship, and irenic collegial interaction

Character and Commitments: Mature and growing Christian faith, agreement with Western Seminary's [Faculty Teaching Position](#), and involvement in and commitment to the local church

Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience
