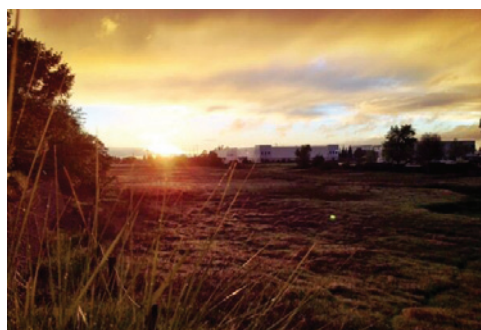
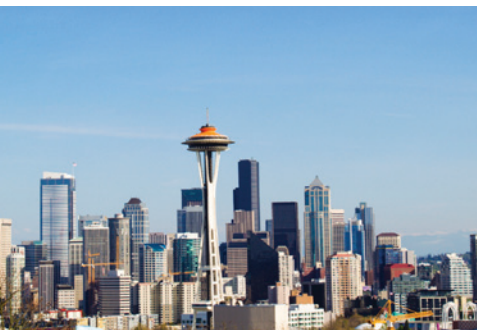

Starting In The Fall Of 2014, Western Will Be Serving Students On-Site in Seattle

As another expression of our desire to partner with local churches to benefit their communities, we are delighted to announce the opening of a Seattle-based teaching site to serve new and current students in the greater Seattle region. Beginning in the fall of 2014, students will have the opportunity to complete a Graduate Studies Certificate entirely at this location or to enroll in credit courses that may be applied towards the completion of a diploma or master's degree through additional coursework completed at one of Western's campuses. The site will be hosted by Mars Hill Church in Bellevue, Washington, with Western providing both the faculty and curriculum. "We are very excited

Western's Newest Faculty Member to Join in Fall of 2014

We are pleased to announce the addition of Dr. Ryan Lister to the Western Seminary faculty. "Some key friends of Western who know Dr. Lister have urged us to hire him for our faculty. After getting to know him, I see why. For he is indeed a great fit by way of theological convictions, teaching style, and godly character," shared President Randal Roberts.

According to Academic Dean, Dr. Rob Wiggins, "Ryan will be teaching courses in systematic theology and biblical studies, including advanced Master of Theology level subjects." Hiring Dr. Lister helps Western occupy the theology spot vacated by Dr. Cortez.

Ryan has received the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Systematic Theology from The Southern Baptist Seminary. He has taught full-time for three years at the undergraduate level in the area of theology and Christian studies and will join the Western Seminary faculty as an Assistant Professor in the 2014-15 academic year. ■

Funding Needed for Repair on Armstrong Hall Columns

Western Seminary's administrative offices reside in what was once the home of Mr. Philip Buehner. Now referred to as Armstrong Hall, the mansion (which was completed in 1909) was once a society home, host to frequent gala events and considered "one of the finest [homes] on the East Side," according to The Oregonian. It is now on the National Register of Historic Places.

Unfortunately, the turn-of-the-century building has begun to show signs of wear. The six Corinthian columns at the front entry are supported by bases that have begun to separate and shift. Numerous holes have also appeared in the columns. Assessment by an engineer has determined that the columns are losing their weight-bearing capacity and are in need of immediate repair.

Renovation will include replacing the column bases and removing, recreating, and replacing the column capitals. Metal columns would be installed and the original outer casing repaired, fitting around the metal columns. This would insure the columns' structural integrity while retaining their original beauty.

The estimated cost of these repairs is \$100,000. Please partner with us as we work to keep our buildings safe, functional, and preserve the history that surrounds our Portland campus. ■
