The King Has Come!

In his announcement to Mary that she would give birth to the Savior, the angel Gabriel said, "He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end" (Luke 1:32-33). Amazing! Right? But look especially at:

"God will give him the throne of David"

- What do I care?! "He will reign over the house of Jacob" – How irrelevant! What does that have to do with me? Nothing? Or Everything?! (Sometimes we can be pretty self-centered.) The angelic message to Mary—and Luke's message to us—is that Jesus is King! Actually, that's what all five lines say. (That's your cue to read it again.)

We need to care about what God cares about, especially when it's The Ultimate Truth of the Universe. It was relevant to Mary. It was relevant to Luke. Luke thought it should be relevant to Theophilus.

What this all means is that this one is going to be the Judge and Ruler of the whole world. That is eternally relevant to the whole world.

Later, when she delivered the baby and an angel appeared to the shepherds, they literally "feared a great fear" (Luke 2:9). A dazzling angel lighting the sky. The Message (verses 10-11): Good News (= Gospel). Joy to the World. Savior-Messiah-Lord. Glory in heaven, *shalom* on earth.

The paradox of it all is enough to amaze any post-modern: Glorious message delivered by glorious messenger; received by lowly shepherds, who were directed to find this eminent embodiment of Hope in a stable, in a manger. The King of Israel, destined to subjugate all kings, all armies, making his appearance in abject humility.

Here is what it means to us: If he is king, then we must bow. All must bow. That's what Faith is. Faith starts with recognizing and believing he is the Lord of all (objectively). When that reality sinks in, you cannot but embrace him as your Lord (subjectively). Faith must submit; it is pledging allegiance.

Five centuries earlier Zechariah spoke of the paradox: "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout in triumph, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; He is just and endowed with salvation, humble, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt, the foal of a donkey" (Zech. 9:9).

And two centuries before that Isaiah also predicted: "A child will be born to us, a son will be given to us" (Isaiah 9:6). A helpless newborn in peasant surroundings. Merry Christmas.

But Isaiah's prophecy also did not stop there; it continues: "And the government will rest on His shoulders." The most important fact about him, whether in Isaiah's writings or Zechariah's or Luke's, is that He is the one destined to reign over the universe forever, the King to rule all kings. **This is The Ultimate Truth of the Universe.**

Great as his first coming was, imagine what the next will bring. "According to His promise we are looking for new heavens and a new earth, in which righteousness dwells" (2 Pet. 3:13).

Joy to the world: the Lord-King has come ... and is coming again!



John E. Johnson is determined to reveal the relevance of John's gospel to today's Christian. To do so, he explores various conversations found in its pages and applies them to our modern world. Jesus converses with family, answers the questions of religious leaders, and steps into dialogue with people whose names we never know but whose struggles we can relate to. They aren't always straightforward chats, Johnson readily admits. Yet that is what makes them so beautifully applicable to the messiness of life.





The Body of Jesus:

A Spatial Analysis of the Kingdom in Matthew (The Library of New Testament Studies)

Little attention is usually given to the space or place of the kingdom. Yet Matthew employs the distinctive phrase "kingdom of heaven" and also portrays Jesus as Immanuel (God with us). In this volume, Patrick Schreiner argues that by expanding one's view of space one can see that Jesus' purpose is to reorder the space of the earth in Matthew as the heavenly king.

Jesus pierces the barrier between the two realms in his incarnation, and the spaces of heaven and earth begin to collide in his ministry. Therefore, in Matthew, Jesus does not just promise a temporal or ethereal kingdom, but one that is located, one that has a sense of rootedness. Jesus is granted authority over this space and inspires people to follow him in this construction project. The spatial kingdom begins in his body, and he extends it to his church by promising his presence.
