Celebrating 25 Years of Teaching

Friday night, January 8th, 1988 was an auspicious day in the history of Western Seminary. A young scholar, working on his PhD dissertation, taught his first six students in a Bible survey course in the large chapel of Calvary Church. Twenty five years later, Dr. Gary Tuck has taught hundreds of students to read and bring the King's message to the world with confidence for life-transforming effect.

While the buildings and classrooms he has taught in have changed over the years, his teaching and preaching have always remained consistent: "King Jesus," "macro before micro," "What is the context of this passage?," "What is the sender's intended meaning?" and "text before event." It is true that those who take a class from Dr. Tuck will never read the Bible in quite the same light or listen to or give a sermon the same way. Above all, his teachings have led his students to have a closer relationship with King Jesus so they may be a light to the world.
