Eight Amazing Days in Asia

We have been privileged, especially in the last 20-ish years, to travel to a number of places around the world. We spent 28 days backpacking around Europe ... not in our 20's or even our 30's. We have been to Israel and other places where the apostles evangelized: Greece, Turkey, Italy. We spent a week in South America, including three days in a rough 'resort' on the Amazon and three weeks in New Zealand and Australia. We traveled coast-to-coast across Canada and have set foot in all 50 states.

So eight years ago my wife, Lynne, planned a trip to Tokyo and Beijing ... which we finally took this past May. We spent three days in Tokyo, one day in Hong Kong, and four days

in Beijing.

We had great weather the entire time, made all of our connections, saw everything we had put on our itinerary, enjoyed good health, and not once did we gag on the food! That's the part I was most worried about.

One of the best parts of the trip was being with several missionaries on their turf: three in Tokyo, one in Hong Kong, and one in Beijing. (Shhh! They are actually English teachers. Wink.)

What a contrast between Japan and China! Boy, have they gone different directions since World War II. Japan was our enemy and China's enemy. Japan became a free-market economic powerhouse, very friendly to the

That was one of the amazing things I 'knew' before we went, but which somehow hadn't hit me. Japan is open to missionaries and has freedom of religion. But the entire nation is almost impenitrable to the Gospel. China is officially atheist and brazenly persecutes Christians to this day, and occasionally, almost randomly. Christianity is expanding as fast there as almost anywhere in the world.

Missionaries in Japan work openly, but have had to devise extraordinarily creative strategies, as traditional evangelism and church planting have almost completely dried up. Still, the numeric results are miniscule. On the other hand, the only creativity Christians in China have had to devise are ways to sneak around to meet in groups. The Gospel gets out, people respond and the Church grows and grows.

Ken and Bola Taylor hosted us in Tokyo. Ken graduated from Western Seminary in Los Gatos about 15 years ago. I had had him in a number of classes. Now God has been doing some amazing things through them. They had been nightclub musicians in the Philippines before coming to the States around 1990. Here they became Christians, came to Western Seminary, graduated, then answered God's call to go to Tokyo!

What is their creative ministry? Music, of course. But not like any 'music ministry' you ever saw. They generate choirs—about 50 now across the greater Tokyo area—to which the non-christian Japanese flock. (And they pay for the privilege of participating.) He teaches them to sing 'American Black Gospel', and twice a year they get all the choirs together for concerts attended by thousands.

At every weekly 2-hour choir rehearsal the pastor of the local sponsoring church gives a devotional and leads in prayer. Every year there are a few converts.

Mark and Mary Esther Penner work with deaf Japanese. Their work is creating a translation of the Bible in Japanese sign language! That's amazing. What's the point? (After all, how many deaf Japanese are there? And how many already know how to read the Bible in Japanese?) The point is, that's what God called them to do! They are reaching a few of God's chosen ones.

John Gibbs is from the Silicon Valley, a Stanford grad, formerly a high powered

"something" in Apple. For some quirky reason he also studied Japanese. Then God brought him to Tokyo ... and now he is writing Bible 'Apps' in Japanese. Seriously!

Ray Zimmerman (not his real name) was the Hebrew and Old Testament professor at Western Seminary. Yes, he was Steve's (Korch) and Judi's (Needham-Penrose) and my colleague, Carrie's (Priest) and Dan's (Ruiz) and Dan's (Jackowitz) and Jeff's (Mammen) Old Testament professor. God took him and wife, Laura (not her real name), to Singapore where he taught at Singapore Bible College and Seminary, and now for the last two years to Hong

Kong, where he teaches a little bit. Mostly, he uses Hong Kong as a base for going to various secret groups in secret locations within a few hours of travel, mostly teaching pastors.

Then there are John and Mary (not their real names), friends of ours for many years in California churches, retired after 40-ish years of pastoring, teaching English to graduate students in a state university in Beijing. We met and lunched with some of their students who are new Christians. (Get it?)

Our God is amazing. He does His work without consulting our strategy braintrusts!

Did you know that Amazon gives discounts for eligible students? Generally, a .edu e-mail address is required, however you may be eligible if you're able to provide proof of enrollment in at least one course at a college or university located in one of the 50 states or the District of Columbia. You may be eligible to enroll in Amazon Student through this alternative process.

To provide proof of enrollment, please send an e-mail to amazon-student-ver-ification@amazon.com from the e-mail address associated with your Amazon.com account. In the message, include one of the following:

* A scan of your student ID displaying the current term or an expiration date; just a

student ID number is not valid

- * A transcript or class list for the current term with your name and your school's name on it
- * A tuition bill for the current term with your name and your school's name on it

You must also include all of the following information:

- * Your name
- * The state where you attend school
- * The name of your college or university
- * Your academic level (e.g., Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior or Graduate)
- * Your major

Amazon will review your submission to determine your eligibility. If they determine you're eligible, you'll receive the Amazon Student enrollment confirmation e-mail within 3-5 business days. By submitting the information requested above, you acknowledge that if your enrollment is confirmed, you agree to these <u>Terms and Conditions</u>.

INTERESTED IN A BOOK EXCHANGE?


