2015-2016 TUITION INCREASE

Beginning with the Fall 2015 semester, tuition will increase to \$550 per credit hour. The audit rate will remain the same reduced rate of \$75 per credit hour. Auditing coaching classes will also remain the same at \$400 per credit hour.

FALL 2015 REGISTRATION CONT.

There is still time to register for the fall semester, however at this point, any registrations need to be made by <u>Academic Petition</u> and will incur a \$25 late fee. Please remember to check in with your advisor to discuss your academic plans for the next semester (and year). Any drops will incur a \$25 late fee. <u>Fall 2015 syllabi</u> are posted online. GRADUATING THIS YEAR?

If you are planning to graduate at the end of this Fall 2015 semester, you'll need to submit an <u>Application to</u> <u>Graduate</u> immediately! If you're planning to graduate at the end of Spring 2016 or Summer 2016, the deadline to submit your **Application to Graduate is November 15**. Submission of this form will initiate a graduation audit, and you'll receive an email confirmation of the remaining requirements for your program within 1-2 months. 
LOST & FOUND
